- 1 1150 Grand Concourse Tenants Association: \$800** to plant flower gardens surrounding historic buildings in the Morrisania area of the Grand Concourse.
  - 2 1560 Grand Concourse Tenants Association: \$1000** to bring residents together for neighborhood clean-up events in the Grand Concourse area.
  - 3 445 E 171st St Block Association: \$700** to promote relationship building among youth and seniors and to create cleaner air for asthma sufferers by planting flowers and trees.
  - 4 Smith Artistic Warriors at Alfred E. Smith Career and Technical Education High School: \$1,300** to bring together local artists and students to create sculptures representing vocational trades for display in public space around the school.
  - 5 Bronx Land Trust: \$500** to run workshops for community gardeners on composting, gardening, maintenance, and finance.
  - 6 Community School 211 Penny Harvest Squad: \$2,000** to improve Friendship Park – a green space on school grounds – by planting shrubs, creating an organic garden, establishing a weather study station, and building planter boxes and benches.
  - 7 For a Better Bronx: \$2,400** to run a youth-led program addressing environmental justice issues in Mott Haven and Hunts Point.
  - 8 John Philip Sousa Middle School 142 Children Can Care group: \$2,700** to transform the school's front lawn into an outside classroom and a garden that is accessible to the surrounding community on evenings and weekends.
  - 9 La Familia Verde: \$2,500** to hold cooking and canning demonstrations at a local weekly farmers' market to promote healthy eating habits.
  - 10 Intermediate School 151 Lou Gehrig Academy: \$2,000** to bring together students and neighborhood residents to beautify the area surrounding the school.
  - 11 New Explorers High School for Film and Humanities: \$500** to work with students to address gang-related issues in Mott Haven.
  - 12 Public School 109 Green Thumbers: \$2,500** to beautify the school by designing and establishing a school garden.
  - 13 Pelham Bay Taxpayers and Civic Association: \$585** to re-energize the group by conducting outreach to attract new members.
  - 14 South Bronx Local Growers: \$2,500** to build and strengthen the South Bronx by creating spaces for residents to grow food, meet, and hold creative arts workshops.
  - 15 Jackson Avenue Block Association: \$2,500** to bring together seniors and youth to promote neighborhood development through a new community garden, and to create a community-gathering space for all residents.
  - 16 Urban Institute of Mathematics Student Government group: \$2,250** to build and strengthen the South Bronx by creating spaces for residents to grow food, meet, and hold creative arts workshops.
  - 17 Validus Prep Environmental Club: \$1,200** to teach students about plants, food, and healthy eating by creating a school garden.
  - 18 Westchester Square Resident Association: \$900** to promote safety and improve the quality of life in Westchester Square.
