

Queens



1 Astoria CSA*: \$3,000 to create a revolving loan program to increase membership among low-income neighborhood residents and to provide access to fresh, local produce at an affordable price.

2 Community School 50 Garden Committee: \$1,300 to convert a vacant lot into a community garden for use by the school and surrounding community in Claremont Village.

3 Citizens Against Graffiti Everywhere: \$1,500 to organize an anti-graffiti boot camp to train 40 to 50 Queens civic leaders on best methods to combat graffiti.

4 Farm Spot Jackson Heights CSA*: \$500 to organize a trip for CSA members to their partner farm to strengthen relationships with the farm and to increase understanding of the food growing process.

5 Jackson Heights Beautification Group Garden Committee: \$1,250 to improve a garden used by neighborhood groups to further its use as a community gathering space.

6 Long Island City CSA*: \$2,300 to establish a revolving loan fund to increase membership among low-income residents and to provide members with reusable cloth bags.

7 Queens Coalition for Parks and Green Spaces: \$1,500 to support a tree pruner alumni association to teach tree and garden maintenance.

8 People's Lawyers Collective: \$500 to provide free legal information workshops in Jackson Heights, Flushing and Jamaica.

9 P.S. 122 Mamie Faye School: \$2,250 to create a "Peace and Sustainability Garden" on school grounds to promote good nutrition and health.

10 Rockaway Waterfront Alliance: \$3,000 to support advocacy efforts to establish a public park in a waterfront area that the group has revitalized, and to conduct environmental education workshops in Rockaway public schools.

11 When it's Real, it's Forever: \$2,000 to establish a block association to organize neighborhood residents around police brutality and gang violence.

12 Thomas Edison High School's Ecology Service Club Honor Society: \$2,000 to increase awareness of the importance and benefits of recycling, and to beautify school grounds with new garden plantings.

13 Ridgewood Reservoir Education and Preservation Project: \$1,000 to restore the natural habitat at Ridgewood Reservoir and rehabilitate the existing ball fields at Highland Park.
