

- 1 **New Lane Shores Resident Association: \$3,000** to support a community watch program run by senior residents.
- 2 **Our Lady of Good Counsel Social Action Committee: \$1,000** to purchase carts for low-income seniors in Stapleton and Tompkinsville to transport their groceries, laundry, etc.
- 3 **Empowerment Zone: \$1,000** to bring together Concord-Stapleton residents from different cultural backgrounds to create "Unity Gardens" by planting flowers in neglected planters.
- 4 **P.S. 13 Margaret Lindenmeyer School: \$2,000** to beautify the school by planting flowers on school grounds.
- 5 **P.S. 29 Bardwell School Community Outreach Program: \$1,600** to launch a school-wide, student-run recycling program for paper, plastic and aluminum, and to plant flowers on and remove litter from school grounds.
- 6 **P.S. 36 John C. Drumgoole Environmental Club: \$2,250** to transform the school lawn into an outdoor classroom for hands-on learning opportunities through gardening and wildlife study.
- 7 **P.S. 69 Daniel D. Tompkins School: \$2,000** to create a more pleasant academic environment by decorating the school's hallways and entrance with plants.
- 8 **P.S. 8 The Shirlee Soomon Great Kills School: \$1,000** to launch an initiative to recycle materials used by the school and to educate the community about recycling.
- 9 **Roza Promotions: \$2,080** to offer a recreational outlet to and develop social and leadership skills among Liberian immigrant youth in Clifton-Concord by establishing a soccer league.



- 10 **Staten Island CSA\*: \$2,500** to provide fresh, organic produce for 23 weeks to seniors living on fixed incomes at two senior housing complexes.

- 11 **Century Dance Complex Drumming Club: \$2,750** to create a drumming club that brings together African-American and African immigrant youth. The club conducts a community tour to showcase authentic African drumming at local parks and community centers.

- 12 **P.S. 41 New Dorp School Student Council: \$1,650** to create an outdoor meeting area on school grounds for use by parents, teachers and students.
